## The Essential Things

Trappist monk, Thomas Merton, was a man of irony – vowed to a life of silence, he was known around the world for his words; living most of his adult life in an American community with other men, he died alone in the foreign city of Bangkok; a pacifist who criticized the war in Southeast Asia, his body was flown home from Vietnam in 1968 aboard a United States Air Force jet.

Living a life of simplicity, it is said that when he died, he had few personal effects. His possessions are a glimpse into what he saw as essential: a watch, two pairs of bifocals, a broken rosary, two leather-bound prayer books, and a small icon of the Virgin and Child. The important things: a way to tell when time is passing – his watch; tools for clarity and a forward-looking vision – his glasses; a reminder of being linked to others and to God, even in brokenness – his rosary; words of wisdom – his prayer books; the image of God – his icon<sup>1</sup>

We all move from one place to another with stuff – things that can be seen and things that are less easy to detect. As I begin my service with you, I find myself reflecting on what I bring – both the important and unimportant, the useful and not so useful. At my very best, I stand before you just as I stand before God, revealing my truest self: a heart for love, a quick laughter, a curious spirit, and a belief in the goodness of each person. And though I am not at my best all of the time, and you will not be at your best all of the time, I promise you this – I will always seek authenticity both in my own being and in yours. I will always strive to be honest and loving, even when I am wrong or unsure, and I will stand with you as we together worship our God and extend our hands as the presence of Christ in this world.

Together we will do amazing things that stem from the most essential possessions of our communal life – a cup holding the symbolic life force of Jesus, water and wine, divinity and humanity and a plate holding the Body given for the healing of the world. I cannot think of a place I would rather be or work I would rather do. Here's to the beginning with blessings for our journey.

## Aids Walk Team Achieves Gold Team Status

Well done to Scott Whittaker and the team of walkers who joined the San Francisco Aids Walk on July 18<sup>th</sup> in Golden Gate Park.

This year the Diocesan Team registered a total of 48 walkers and achieved for the first time Gold Status (raising at least \$10,000). That distinction meant they were in the top 25 fundraising teams. They raised \$21,506 and ranked up with teams like Pixar, Levi Strauss, Chevron, Google, Williams-Sonoma, Bank of America, PG&E, Blue Shield, Kaiser Permanente, Catholic Charities, Gap and Wells Fargo.
