## Winter Relief Program 2007

The program began in August 2000 when the waiting list for Sunrise Village reached 50 families. After meeting with local faith communities, the Winter Relief Program began providing emergency shelter in January 2001. Over the course of the four months of the program, 24 families with 36 Adults and 49 children (85 people) found help.

The waiting list has continued to grow each winter, and the churches have continued to help meet the needs of these families by providing food, sleeping sites, transportation, programs for the children, and other services. Volunteers are a key reason of the success of the program.

How can we help? By providing a temporary home...

Host congregations invite guests to use their facility as their temporary home. During the host month, when volunteers enter their church or temple, they know that they are entering their guests' home. By experiencing their congregation's facility in this way, volunteers can help identify with the needs of their guests.

St. James' will be a host congregation for the Month of November and is looking for help with the effort. Here's how...

- Be an Overnight Volunteer. Overnight Volunteers help transport guests from Centerville Presbyterian at 7:45pm and arrival at the Host congregation at 8pm. Volunteers assist the Shelter Monitor in helping residents get settled in for the night (ie, set up beds and get adults and children in bed for lights-out at 10pm.) Volunteers need not sleep in the same room as residents, but should be available to...
- Assist the Shelter Monitor during the night if a situation arises that may require the Shelter Monitor to be offsite (emergency illness of residents, etc.), or to leave the room for an extended period of time (to call 911, etc).
- Assist the Shelter Monitor at 6:30am in setting up breakfast for any residents who may need it.
- Assist the Shelter Monitor with returning the sleeping room to its original set up, if necessary.

## Make the Money

Louise learned from the Red Cross how to make a money-back gift and now she wanted to make one for her parish. So she called the Gift Planning Office and discovered that a gift annuity for her parish would pay her 9.9%— guaranteed.

In fact, since most of this income would be received tax-free, the effective yield would be 16.4%. This was more than three-times what she was making on her CD's at the time.

When Tom, a younger member of her parish, learned about this and the income tax deduction that went with it, he inquired how it might work for him. What he discovered is that by delaying the start of the income until his retirement age, he could obtain a payout rate even higher than Louise's and an immediate income tax deduction.

Both Louise and Tom wished to remember both their parish and another ministry in some way in their estate plans. Both found that a gift annuity was a very beneficial way to do so.

With a gift annuity, you benefit now and your church benefits later. You receive fixed lifetime income and upon your death your church receives the remaining principal. Both benefit—and your legacy is future ministry in the name of Christ.

## God Shoes

In early October, St. James' presented \$540 in Payless Shoe Store gift cards to the Tri-Cities Homeless Coalition (TCHC) Sunrise Village Homeless Shelter.

Thanks to the generous outpouring of love and support from St. James' parishioners, the children at Sunrise Village geared up for the new school year with new shoes to replace outgrown or worn-out ones. Please stop by the bulletin board in the parish hall to see a thank you note from them.

Continuing this special outreach project reminds me of a sermon by a visiting priest from the diocese who preached at St. James' in July 2005 and who incorporated his own new shoe story. This priest (I apologize for not remembering his name!) shared wonderful recollections of growing up in a large Mexican family. Although the family was not wealthy in terms of finances, they were wealthy in terms of love and faith.

Once when the priest was a young boy in need of shoes before the winter started, he went to his parents to ask for shoes. His parents regrettably reminded him that they had no money and could not afford to buy him shoes. Instead, they assured him that somehow God would provide for his needs, and they encouraged him to pray. So, he prayed, and he prayed. Then, one day he ran into someone in the local town who was buying shoes for children who needed them, including this young boy. When the boy ran home in his new shoes to show his parents, they were shocked. They asked him where he got the shoes. The boy told them that they were his "God Shoes". He had listened and followed his parent's instructions to pray for his needs to be met, and fully believing that God cares for us and provides for our needs, the little boy was certain that the God had sent him the new "God Shoes."

Thank you for your caring and generosity - and for being instruments of God to provide "God Shoes" to those in need. Although this marks the conclusion of the new shoe outreach for 2007, we hope to undertake a similar campaign next summer as the next school year approaches.



## Tai Chi Classes at St. James'

You are invited to renew your body and mind with a weekly class of Tai Chi at St James'. In November, classes will be held in EB#4 on Thursday Nov 1, and on Wednesdays Nov 7, 14 and 21 from 6:30-7:30pm. Classes will be taught by Sylvia Ma, a certified instructor of Guang Ping style Tai Chi. Tai Chi is a form of internal martial arts originated in China 700 years ago. It is a physical exercise and a moving meditation that focuses the mind while conditioning the body. Because the whole body moves as one, Tai Chi cultivates the link between mind and body, enhancing balance and coordination. The Guang Ping style of Tai Chi was brought to the United States by Great Grandmaster Kuo Lien Ying in 1965. Come and find out if practicing Tai Chi could help you learn to relax; improve your flexibility and balance; reduce stress; enhance your feeling of well being, develop a peaceful mind; and increase your spirituality. Bring your family, friends, and neighbors. Wear comfortable, loose clothing and flat shoes with non-slippery sole. The fee will be \$40 a month, or a drop-in rate of \$12 per class (scholarships are available from St. James', please contact Bob Honeychurch).

In Mexico, Christmas is an important holiday season with strong traditions. One of the most colorful traditions is the *posada* party, celebrated every evening from December 16 to 24. These celebrations commemorate Mary and Joseph’s cold and difficult journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of shelter. “*Posada*” in Spanish, simply means lodging or shelter.

Nowadays, the *posada* has evolved into a religious and social celebration, paying a festive homage to the journey. Each Christmas season, a processional carrying a doll representing the Christ Child and images of Joseph and Mary riding a burro walks through the community streets. The processional stops at a previously selected home and asks for lodging for the night. The people are invited in to read scriptures and sing Christmas carols called *villancicos*. Refreshments are provided by each host. The happy end to each *posada* has always been the *piñata*.

Our *posada* journey will proceed around various points on our campus, ending in a grand celebration in the Parish Hall. All ages, from little ones to grandparents, will enjoy this spiritual entrance to the Christmas season. Bring your flashlight!

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## News From the Kitchen Staff

We have had a great start to our new Coffee Hour System. Thank you to the Lead Team, Disciple Builders, and the Choir (who have done Coffee Hour at this writing).

We really appreciate your work and your willingness to help the whole St. James' community.

The sign-up sheet for the future is posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall. It is part of a new section called Kitchen Korner. If you are part of a ministry that hasn't had a chance to sign up to do Coffee Hour, please do so. Please include the name of the ministry and a contact name with phone number. Ruth Poole will give the contact person a reminder call the week prior to your assigned date.

All the details you need are written and posted in the kitchen. In addition, we have a few guidelines for everyone using the kitchen to follow:

1. When washing dishes, please put away all dishes, utensils, and pots and pans, including the dish drainer. All dishes must be washed by hand. There is no dishwasher. Please refrain from using the Sanitizer because it does not meet current standards.
2. Most drawers and cupboards are marked to facilitate your putting everything away washed and dried.
3. Our plumbing system can not handle ANY food particles. Everything must be scraped into the garbage cans. Please observe the posted orange signs.
4. Our kitchen is used by many and it has limited counter, shelf and cupboard space. Items that appear, without a name, including random donations, may be discarded.
5. If you are putting food in the refrigerator, please mark it with your name or event and the date. Leftovers that are not labeled will be discarded. Help us reduce the amount of work we will have to do by following this guideline.
6. There are "utility towels" under the counter near the stove. There are dish-drying towels in a marked drawer. Please use each for their respective tasks. Place soiled towels in one of the clear plastic containers under the counter.
