Thanks All Around

As we look back on all of the events of the last several weeks of March, it is almost too much to take in. Ingathering For Your “Hope Chest” Coins

Do you remember all of those red and black boxes distributed at the beginning of Lent for you to gather your loose change in support of the Episcopal Relief and Development fund – the ones with those pictures of the really cute kids on them? Well, it’s time to dust them off and bring them into church for our ingathering. We will be collecting those boxes at all services on Sunday, April 6, 2008. Worship Changes at the 8am Service

Beginning with our Pentecost service on May 11, a change in the worship format for our 8 am service will be noticed by our early Sunday risers. The format for that service will change from “Rite 1” to “Rite 2.” For those of you who aren’t conversant with “Episco-lingo,” this means that the most noticeable change is that we will be moving away from an Elizabethan language style to a modern language style for our worship; from “thee” to “you,” from “thy” to “your,” and some other words that we don’t understand like “succor,” “bounden,” “vouchsafe” and “brake” [the past tense of “break”], etc.

Not only is the language different, but so, too, is the theology expressed in the worship. The language expressed in our “Rite 2” service really does much more reflect a contemporary understanding of our relationship with God than does the language of “Rite 1.” Prior to Pentecost, a special education session will be held to discuss these changes and to explore the difference in theology between our Rite 1 and Rite 2 services. The service will still be quiet and reflective, with no music except on special occasions. And it will still precede the best breakfast gathering anywhere in Fremont at the Cabrillo Café.

Premiere Performance

You are invited to the Spring Concert of the Ohlone Community College to hear the first live performance of the song *Night Song*. Our own Rod Whitehouse composed and arranged this song for the choir and will accompany the choir on guitar. Concert will be held at the Centerville Presbyterian Church on Saturday, May 10 at 3pm. Tickets are \$15 for adults and \$10 for students and seniors.

Finding Fun in a Weak Economy

Walk-a-Rock-a-Thon

Saturday, April 26, 2008, 9:00 am

For at least the past four years in April, St. James' has held a Walk-a-Rock-a-Thon, a fundraiser event to benefit Tri-City Homeless Coalition's Winter Relief program—a program that grew out of the need to get people off city streets during the cold, winter months.

The money raised during the Walk-a-Rock-a-Thon gives St. James' the opportunity to pay for certain costs when we host families participating in the Winter Relief program. The remainder of the funds is donated to Tri-City Homeless Coalition. Last year we raised \$2100.

We are trying something different this year—walking and rocking with our sister parish, St. Anne's, located in the Irvington District. Instead of our usual loop through the immediate Centerville neighborhood, we will gather at St. Anne's and walk with two routes available—a short route to the Tri-City Homeless Coalition administrative offices, and a longer route—to St. James'. The routes are still being planned, but the short route would be approximately 1 mile, and the longer route would be approximately 5 miles. And, of course, for those who don't or can't walk, rockers will be available at either parish.

Worship and Christian Formation Cluster

Who are we?

The Worship and Christian Formation Cluster consists of many groups within St. James' that contribute to the preparation of worship services and the various religious study and Christian education programs we offer.

It is a diverse cross section of St. James' members, from those who participate in the services and help prepare for each of the three services to those who teach the Sunday school and adult education courses and those who lead study/meditation groups during the week.

The Altar Guild, consisting of four teams, sets up the altar for each service, clean and take care of the linen, silver and pottery used in the communion and makes sure that there are bread and wine for each service. Acolytes play a key role in the service, helping the priests prepare the table for communion, leading the procession into and out of the service and lighting the candles. The eucharistic ministers assist the priests with the communion, lead the prayers and lead the readings.

The Liturgical Design Committee's mission is to outwardly symbolize God's Word, grace and blessings with the liturgical decorations in the two churches. From the vibrant colors of Pentecost and Christmas to the simplicity of Lent's minimal decorations, and with the thoughtful contributions of members of the parish, the decorations give a unique vision to the services. Members of the choirs at St. James', under the guidance of choir director Katherine LaRose, provide music for the 11am Sunday services and for other special occasions. The 9 am folk service has music provided by Music Footprints, led by Rod Whitehouse. Katherine also works with the children's choir, which will sing next on Mother's Day.

The Christian education groups offer a range of study, participation, prayer and reflection. These include Genore Schaaf, who has been leading a morning study group in her home since 1980, and Brad Hoffman, who leads the evening Bible group, as well as Barbara Lyon's meditation group for the community at her home and Pam Young's Circle of Prayer.

Godly Play offers two classes for ages four through second grade and third through sixth grade. Disciple Builders just completed a wonderful "Faith(s) in Our Neighborhoods" series for Lent that brought speakers to discuss their religions - the Fremont Hindu Community, Temple Beth Torah, the Buddhist Temple and the Islamic Community. The Thursday evening programs drew an average of 30 to 35 people, many from outside St. James' who had heard about the series. Another well received series that just ended was the "To Belong" discussions led by Sylvia Sweeney at 10 am Sundays during Lent.
